## Four major points of Suwon tourism of Suwon perfect for starting a tours

### 01 Suwon Hwaseong Fortress

As the city's top tourist spot, this zone has Suwon Hwaseong Fortress and Hwaseong Haenggung Palace, as well as museums, art galleries, Workshop Street and Theme Street.

### 02 Dongsuwon

Around Dongsuwon IC and Gwanggyo Sanghyeon IC, the major entrances to Suwon, are museums of varying themes as well as Gwanggyo Lake Park and Gwanggyosan Mountain.

### 03 Around Suwon City Hall

The zone has Rha Hye-suk Street commemorating Korea's leading "new woman" and independence fighter, and Wolhwawon (Hyowon Park), famous as a filming site for TV dramas.

### 04 Seosuwon

This zone is like a delicacy of tourism in Suwon. The wide-opened waterside spaces Chungmanje and Manseokgeo are scenic reservoirs built by King Jeongjo hundreds of years ago.

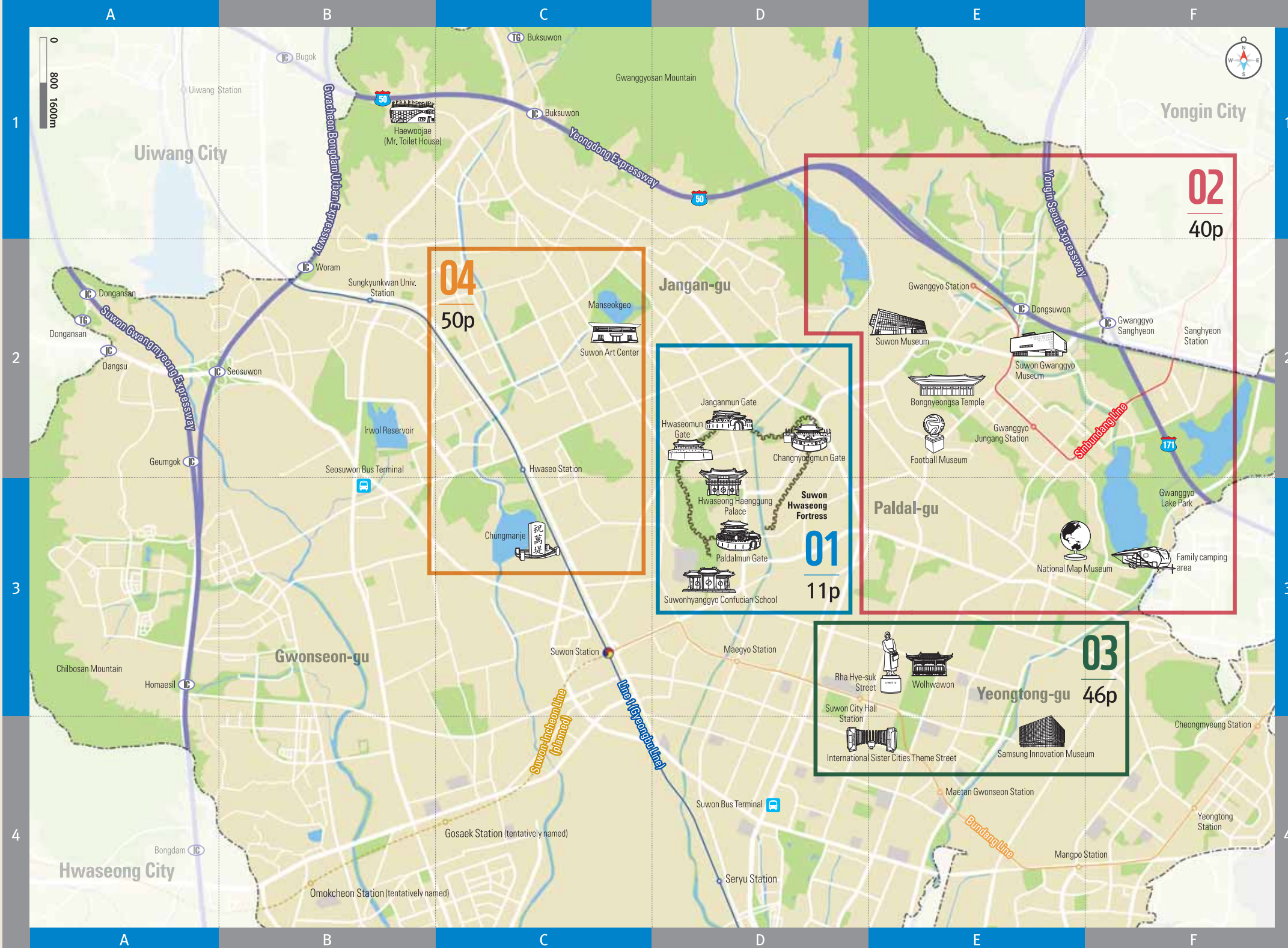

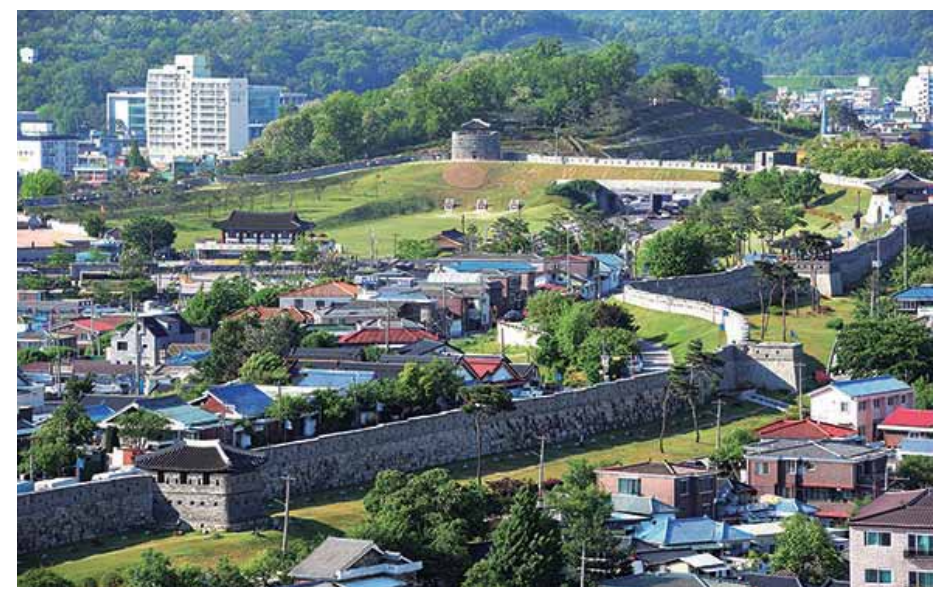

# 01 UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Suwon Hwaseong Fortress

**This is the starting point for tourism in Suwon.**

Suwon Hwaseong Fortress was built by King Jeongjo (22nd king of the Joseon Dynasty) to serve as a military stronghold as he sought to secure his power. Located within the fortress is Hwaseong Haenggung Palace, another must-visit site. The fortress is where the filial piety of King Jeongjo and his love for the people are enshrined and where the 60th birthday of his mother, Hyegyeong Hong, was held. With interactive programs and events held around Hwaseong Haenggung Palace, the fortress is the city's most visited tourist site. Near the palace is Eco Mobility Village. Visitors can comfortably look around Haenggung-dong on a Velo taxi and the entire fortress on the Hwaseong Royal Train. Also nearby are Suwon Hwaseong Museum, which shows how the fortress was constructed at a glance, and Suwon I'Park Museum of Art, which displays modern contemporary art. Places also abound famous for fried chicken and soondae (Korean sausage), two foods tourists must try when visiting Suwon. At the traditional market formed as Suwon Hwaseong Fortress was built, a variety of fashion items, medicine, agriculture and livestock are sold. Many tourists come to the market just for shopping. By hiking up Paldalsan Mountain from the palace parking lot, visitors can see Hyowon's Bell. A spectacular view of Suwon is available from Seojangdae. The Statue of King Jeongjo in the middle of Paldalsan Mountain is also a can't-miss spot.



## Recommended tours in Suwon Hwaseong Fortress

This recommended one-day course includes the 24 Martial Arts Performance (Jangyongyeong Guard Ritual) held at Sinpungnu Gate, the main gate of Suwon Hwaseong Fortress and Hwaseong Haenggung Palace. This course allows visitors to see about half of the fortress.

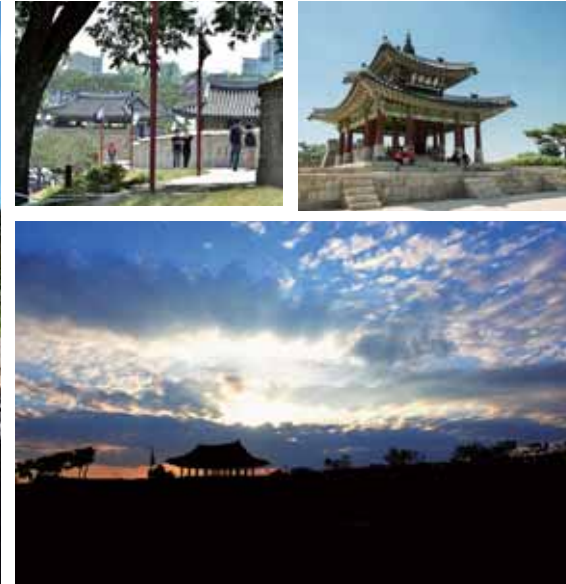

# Suwon Hwaseong Fortress

National Historical Site No. 3



Elegant and majestic, Suwon Hwaseong Fortress is an anomaly in the history of Korean fortress construction. Much of it was destroyed during the Japanese colonial period and the Korean War, but it was restored from 1975 to 1979 based on "Hwaseong Fortress Uigwe (Royal Protocols)." In December 1997, the fortress was named a UNESCO World Heritage. Selected as one of "50 Beautiful Places to Visit in Korea" by CNN and the "Star of Korean Tourism" in 2012, the fortress is an excellent tourist destination with high historical and cultural value.

## Useful information

### Information for first-time visitors to Suwon Hwaseong Fortress

The 5.7km-long fortress is located at the center of Suwon. A *dulle-gil* (surrounding path) is formed along its walls. Though the path is a dirt road, walking on it is fine thanks to constant maintenance.

Since the fortress is connected through a single road, visitors can start a tour at any point.

For those using public transportation, a handy tip is to start the tour at Paldalmun Gate because Hwaseong Haenggung Palace is nearby and public transportation is well connected from Suwon Station to the gate. Right next to the bus stop is Paldalmun Market, and Fried Chicken Street is just a five-minute walk away.

Visitors using cars can park at the parking lots of Hwaseong Haenggung Palace or Yeonmudae (Dongjangdae, Eastern Command Post) and start the tour from the nearby fortress. Please note that the palace parking lot is packed with cars on weekends and holidays. In this case, use of the Yeonmudae parking lot is recommended. The basic parking fee is 2,000 KRW for three hours. A ticket from either the palace or Yeonmudae parking lot is valid at either place.

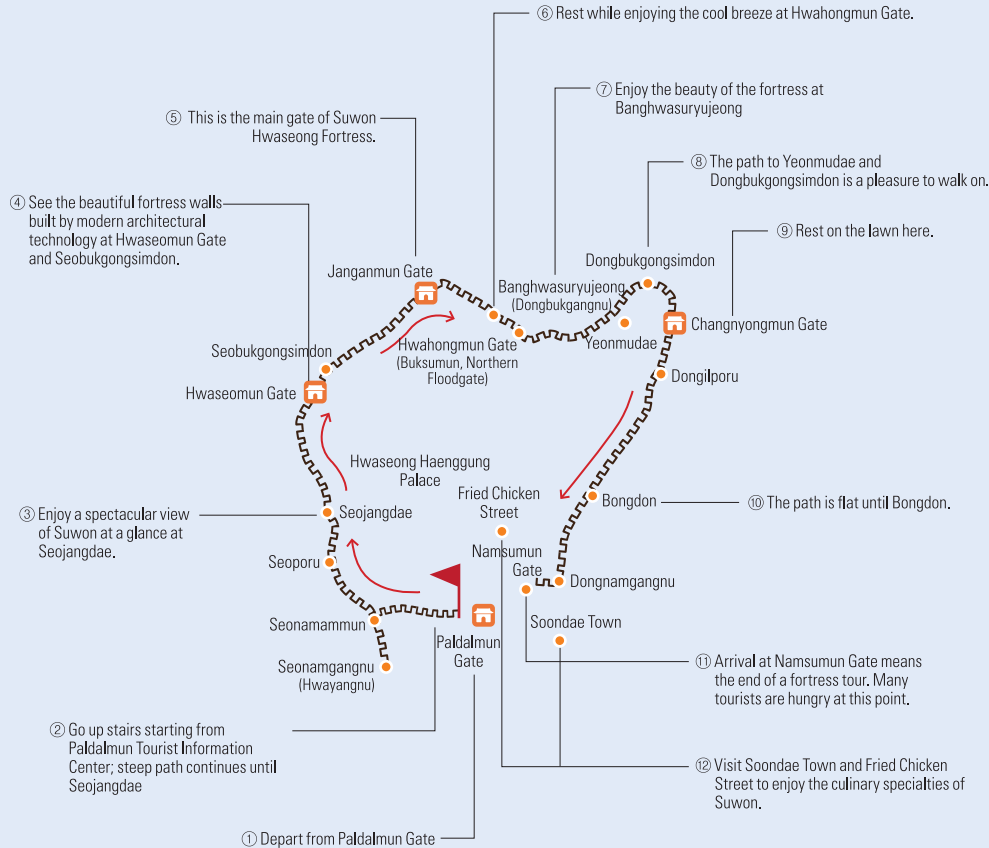


## How should one tour Suwon Hwaseong Fortress?

As with most tours, walking is the best way to enjoy the fortress, with an estimated 20,000 walking steps needed to properly view it. The fortress is bound by a dulle-gil path, and sometimes going up Paldalsan Mountain is needed, yet this is no difficult path. Five ways to tour the fortress are recommended.

### Looking around the entire fortress

Between 3.5 and five hours needed  
(based on one's walking speed)



## Five ways to tour Suwon Hwaseong Fortress.

### 1 Looking around the entire fortress

To properly enjoy the fortress, visitors must see all of it. More than just walls, the fortress comprises buildings such as command posts, sentry post, beacon tower, fortifications, watchtower and pavilions. Since their construction was based on geographic features, Seojangdae (Western Command Post), which is built on the mountain Paldalsan, and Dongjangdae (Eastern Command Post), which is built on a flat land, look different. Seeing the entire fortress makes visitors understand these differences at a glance.

## Yeonmudae (Dongjangdae, Eastern Command Post) [MAP 9](#)

The top of Yeonmudae, a former military installation in which soldiers trained and received orders, offers a panoramic view of Suwon. Yeonmudae is near Changnyongmun Gate with a variety of exciting sights and activities such as traditional archery. Going to the command post to see the beautiful sunset is also highly recommended.

**How to visit** Yeonmudae is across the parking lot of Yeonmudae (two-minute walk, flat path)

## 2 Select tours of Suwon Hwaseong Fortress

While seeing the entire fortress to fully appreciate its magnificence and elegance is advised, tourists who lack the time or physical stamina to do so can opt to see select attractions of the fortress. So what are these attractions? The following are popular with many tourists. (See 9 ~ 10p on the map)

### Seobukgongsimdon [MAP 6](#)

Unique to Suwon Hwaseong Fortress is Gongsimdon, a watchtower where guards used to monitor remote locations. In 1797, King Jeongjo visited the fortress and expressed his satisfaction with it to his vassals by saying, "This is the first gongsimdon to be built in the country. Look at it as much as you like." Seobukgongsimdon (National Treasure No. 1710) is adjacent to Hwaseomun Gate. The view while walking from Seojangdae to the gate is simply beautiful. Seobukgongsimdon is preserved in its original form at the time of its construction and shows a remarkable architectural image.



**How to visit** ① Walk 15 minutes from Hwaseong Haenggung Plaza through Eco Mobility Village (flat path) ② Walk 25 minutes from Seojangdae to Hwaseomun Gate along the fortress walls (downhill stairs and slopes)

### Banghwasuryujeong (Dongbukgangnu, Northeastern Pavilion) [MAP 8](#)

"Gaknu" is located on a high hill with a great view. As a pavilion for resting, it also served as a surveillance station to monitor surrounding areas. Dongbukgangnu Pavilion (National Treasure No. 1709) is a pavilion protruding outward and located in a strategically important place with a gorgeous surrounding landscape. Among the buildings within the fortress, the pavilion boasts an exquisite beauty that earned it the name Banghwasuryujeong (meaning "beautiful pavilion").

**How to visit** ① Walk 15 minutes from Hwaseong Haenggung Palace along the stream Suwoncheon (flat path) ② Walk 15 minutes from the parking lot of Yeonmudae to Janganmun Gate along the fortress walls (slow slopes good for walking)

### Hwahongmun (Buksumun, Northern Floodgate) [MAP 7](#)

Suwoncheon Stream was called Beodeunae during the Joseon Dynasty. Beodeunae passed through the fortress and the place where it entered the fortress was called Buksumun, and the spot where water in the fortress came out was Namsumun Gate. Buksumun Gate was also called Hwahongmun Gate. In summer, water spilling from the seven arches creates a harmonic beauty with the surrounding environment, making Hwahongmun Gate one of the Eight Scenic Spots of Suwon.

**How to visit** ① Walk 15 minutes from Hwaseong Haenggung Palace along the stream Suwoncheon (flat path) ② Walk 17 minutes from the parking lot of Yeonmudae to Janganmun Gate along the fortress walls (slow slopes good for walking)

### 3 Tour of four gates

Suwon Hwaseong Fortress has four main gates, and visitors are advised to set them as destinations and look around the nearby walls. (See 9 ~ 10p on the map)



#### Paldalmun Gate (National Treasure No. 402)

MAP 1

Paldalmun Gate, the fortress' south gate, means "opening paths to all directions." The left and right of the walls are disconnected, and new streets and buildings have been built in this disconnected area to develop traditional markets around the nearby Suwoncheon Stream. This gate is the closest to Hwaseong Haenggung Palace and preserved in its original form at the time of its construction.

**How to visit** Walk six minutes from palace (flat path)

#### Janganmun Gate MAP 3

Though the north gate of the fortress, Janganmun Gate is called the front gate of the fortress since King Jeongjo entered Suwon through this gate. "Jangan" means "the people live happily." From nearby Jangan Park, visitors can see Bukporu (Northern Sentry Post) and Bukseoporu (Northwestern Cannon Fort) along with Janganmun Gate toward the direction of the fortress. Janganmun Gate shows the essence and magnificence of the fortress.

**How to visit** Walk 15 minutes from Hwaseong Haenggung Palace through Suwon Traditional Culture Center (flat path) 📍 37.288851, 127.014309

#### Hwaseomun Gate (National Treasure No. 403)

MAP 2

Harmonizing well with the silver grass in the nearby park, Hwaseomun Gate is heavily visited by tourists especially in autumn. As the west gate of the fortress, it played a role in defending the west together with Seobukgongsimdon (Northwestern Watchtower). To be enjoyed while moving from Seojangdae to the gate, Hwaseomun Gate and Seobukgongsimdon are called masterpieces of modern architectural technology.

**How to visit** Walk 15 minutes from palace through Eco Mobility Village (flat path)

#### Changnyongmun Gate MAP 4

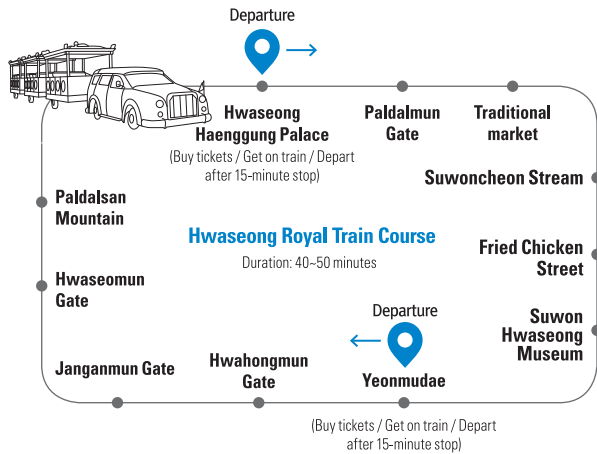
This gate's name means "Taking charge of the eastern part of Hwaseong Fortress." The gate's size and shape are almost the same as those of Hwaseomun Gate. Changnyongmun Gate's ravishing appearance is based on balance and order. Nearby are Yeonmudae (Dongjangdae, Eastern Command Post), Traditional Archery Experiential Center and Flying Suwon, which is a pile-supported helium balloon. Changnyongmun Gate also offers a scenic night view of the fortress.

**How to visit** Changnyongmun Gate is across the parking lot of Yeonmudae (two-minute walk, flat path)

## 4 Touring on Hwaseong Royal Train MAP 9, 12

The Hwaseong Royal Train is the most comfortable way to tour the fortress, going around the fortress interior and exterior. Though the fortress can be fully appreciated on foot, the train offers a surprising pleasure of touring around the fortress while riding comfortably. The train was created with the motif of the car used by Korea's last emperor Sunjong and the sedan chairs used by Joseon Dynasty kings.

#### Symbol of Suwon, the city of filial piety Hyowon's Bell MAP 21

Touring around Hwaseong Haenggung Palace, visitors can sometimes hear the deep ringing of a bell. "A bell in daytime? Where's it coming from?" Hyowon's Bell is on top of the Paldalsan Mountain. The bell is rung three times; the first for the health of one's parents, the second for the health of one's family, and the third for fulfilling one's wishes. Any visitor to Suwon can ring this big bell.

## 5 Viewing from above while riding Flying Suwon MAP 22

What does Suwon look like from the sky? By riding the pile-supported helium balloon Flying Suwon, visitors can see Suwon and its world-famous fortress at one glance. This balloon can hold up to 20 passengers and reaches an altitude of 70~150 m. The near absence of shaking makes it a comfortable experience.

Riding Flying Suwon with lighting at night brings out the amazing scenery of the fortress through a vivid evening view. No ride is allowed when wind speed exceeds 13 meters per second so calling ahead is highly recommended.

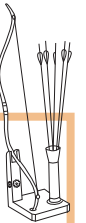

# Hwaseong Haenggung Palace

MAP ②  
National Historical Site No. 478



This palace was built under Paldalsan Mountain in 1789 as Suwon Sineupchi was constructed. Extension works for the palace followed as construction of Suwon Hwaseong Fortress started. The palace was completed in 1796. Because of his high filial piety, Joseon Dynasty King Jeongjo visited Hyeollyungwon (now Yungneung) Royal Tomb, the tomb of his father Prince Sado, 13 times. On every visit, the king stayed at the palace. At the time of construction, it had the shape of a formal castle with 576 sections and was the country's largest and most beautiful temporary palace. Unfortunately, all buildings were destroyed in the Japanese colonial period except for Nangnamheon Hall. Restoration work started in 1996 per "Hwaseong Fortress Uigwe (Royal Protocols)." The palace was again unveiled in October 2003; the second stage of restoration is underway.

## Visiting every corner of Hwaseong Haenggung Palace

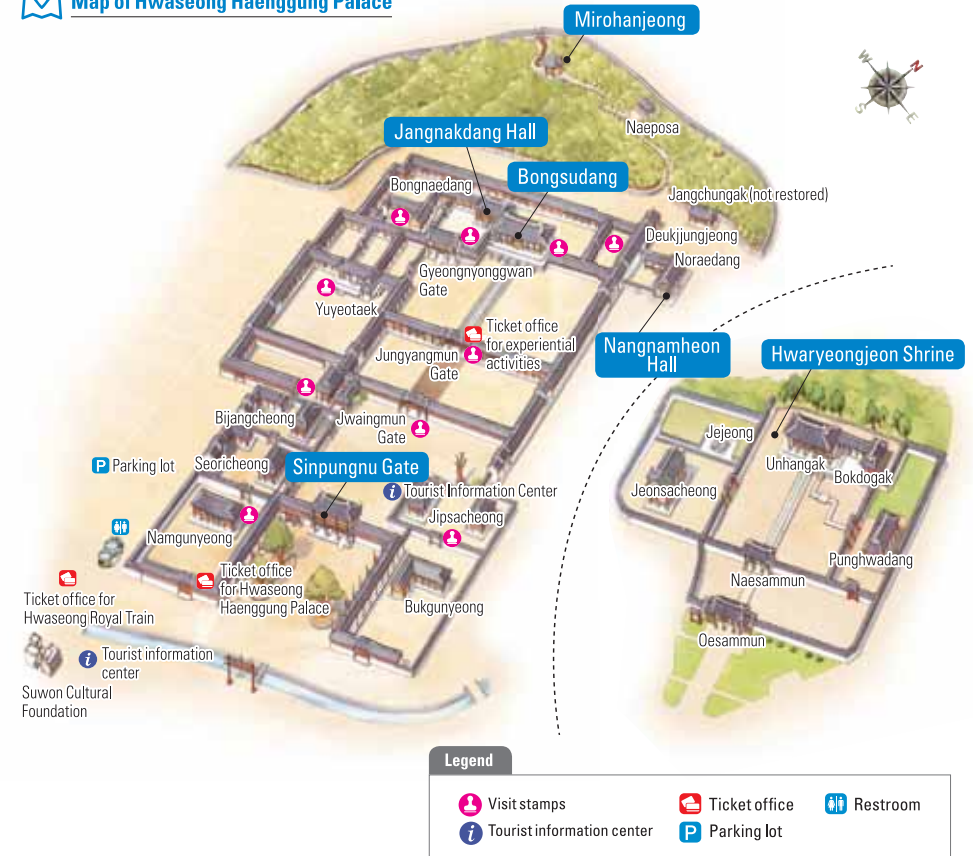
For tourists in Suwon, this palace is a must-visit attraction because of its historical significance and many attractions.

## Watching performances at **Sinpungnu Gate**

Sinpungnu Gate hosts colorful events such as the 24 Martial Arts Performance, Jangyongyeong Guard Ritual and Hwaseong Haenggung Permanent Hanmadang. Watching just one of these performances will make visiting Hwaseong Haenggung Palace worthwhile. Surprisingly, all of these shows are free of charge, making a Suwon tour much more exciting. ### **24 Martial Arts Performance**

## Meeting with Hyegeyeongung Hong(King Jeongjo's mother) at

### **Bongsudang and Jangnakdang Hall**

Showing the highest filial piety, King Jeongjo in 1795 opened the 60th birthday ceremony of his mother Hyegeyeongung Hong at Bongsudang. Though Seoul was the normal venue for holding all events related to the royal family, this unique event took place at Hwaseong Haenggung Palace. A map explains the ceremony and the model of foods served during the ensuing feast. Jangnakdang Hall was the bedroom of the king's mother. In consideration of her, King Jeongjo had Bongsudang and Jangnakdang Hall connected to each other.

## Feeling King Jeongjo's love for his people at

### **Nangnamheon Hall**

Nangnamheon Hall is the only building left intact within Hwaseong Haenggung Palace, with a space inside to host events.

Here, King Jeongjo held temporary gwageo, the highest-level state examination during the Joseon Dynasty. At the 60th birthday ceremony of his mother, he invited all elderly residents of Suwon age 61 or older to a feast. He showed his love for the people by eating the same number of foods served to them.

To the participants of the feast, the king presented silk, oil paper and canes and had his guests take home all the leftover food.

A superstition says that hugging the pillar of Nangnamheon Hall will attract good energy as the hall endured oppression from Japanese imperialism.

**Royal portrait of King Jeongjo at **Hwaryeongjeon Shrine** (National Historical Site No. 115)**

King Jeongjo, who devoted himself to his country and people, suddenly died on June 18, 1800, at age 49. After his death, his son King Sunjo built Hwaryeongjeon Shrine next to Hwaseong Haenggung Palace in 1801 and enshrined the royal portrait of his father there. Unlike ordinary shrines where ancestral tablets are stored to perform rites, Hwaryeongjeon Shrine enshrines the royal portrait of the former king with all due courtesies the king received over his lifetime.



**Seeing Hwaseong Haenggung Palace from **Mirohanjeong****

Mirohanjeong means a "pavilion for leisurely rest," a name reflecting the will of King Jeongjo, who wanted to give up the throne to the crown prince in 1804 and move to Suwon Hwaseong Fortress. Mirohanjeong offers a scenic view of the palace at a glance.

## Statue of King Jeongjo MAP

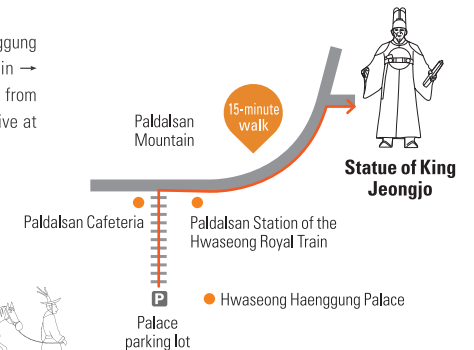
After experiencing both Suwon Hwaseong Fortress and Hwaseong Haenggung Palace, meeting King Jeongjo should be next on the tour itinerary. He ordered the construction of both structures. One of the greatest kings in Korean history, he also developed Suwon as a new city. Historians call Suwon the first planned city in Asia.

The greatness of King Jeongjo didn't stop there. Though the Joseon Dynasty featured a caste system, he loved his people beyond status, thus he stabilized the country and governed public welfare through communication and reformed politics.

His statue is located at the foot of Paldalsan, the mountain behind the palace. Visitors can easily find the statue, which is six meters high and three meters wide, by climbing up the mountain through the palace parking lot. On the wall of the building behind the statue is a sketch of a long journey, illustration and engraving about the King Jeongjo's achievements.

**Directions** From the parking lot of Hwaseong Haenggung Palace, go up the stairs toward Paldalsan Mountain → Move right at Paldalsan Cafeteria → Move 150 meters from Paldalsan Station of the Hwaseong Royal Train → Arrive at Statue of King Jeongjo

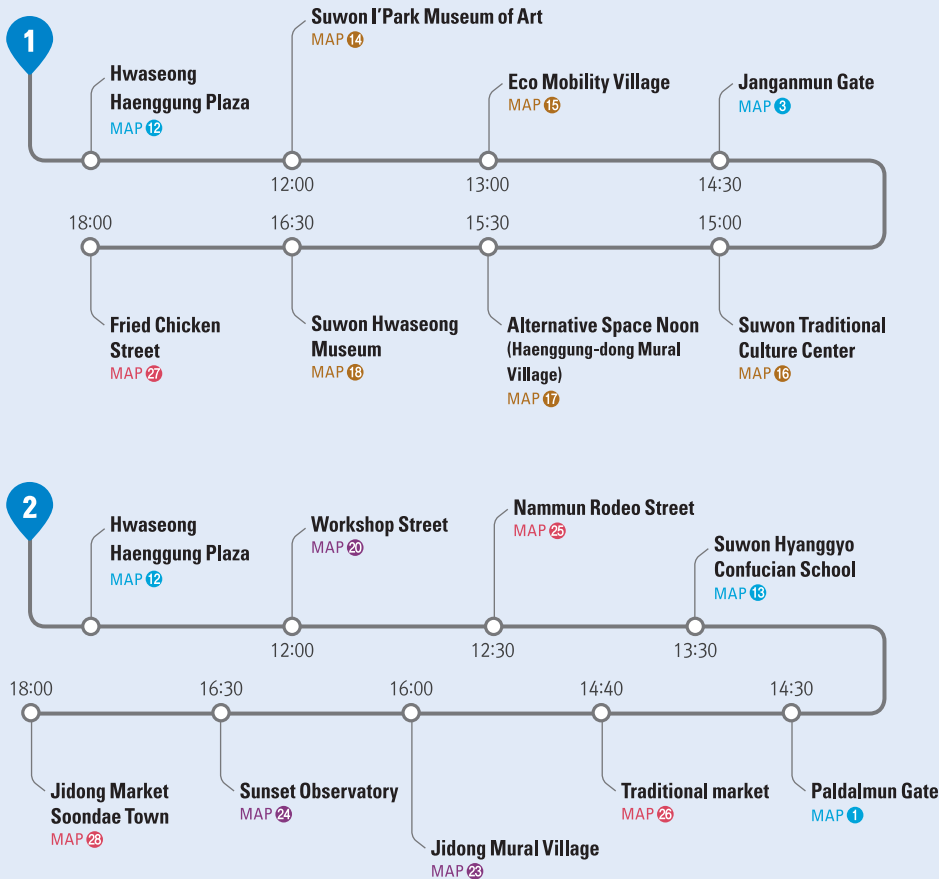

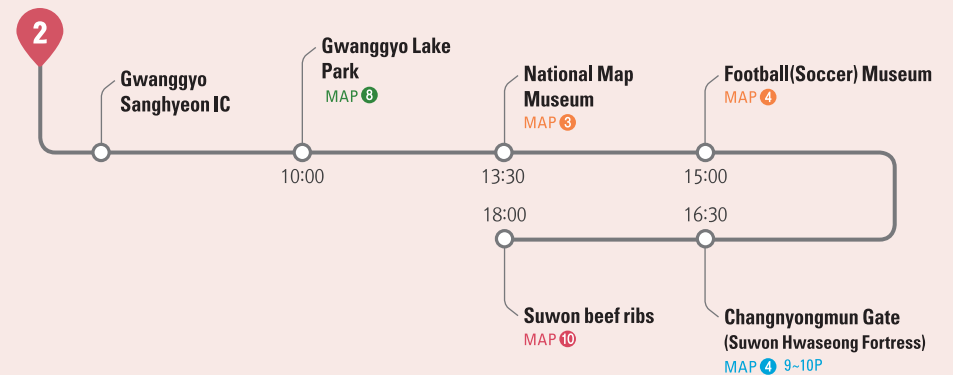
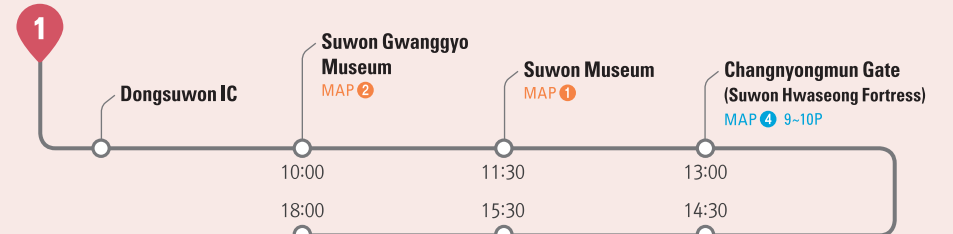
## Dongsuwon

The tourist attractions of Dongsuwon (East Suwon) Zone are close to Dongsuwon IC (Yeongdong Expressway) and Gwanggyo Sanghyeon IC (Yongin Seoul Expressway). Using the Sinbundang subway line will bring easy access to these attractions. The metropolitan bus system going to and from Seoul is also smooth, making accessibility to Dongsuwon Zone great.



## Recommended tours







Dongsuwon features great nature spots widely spread out such as Gwanggyo Lake Park, Gwanggyo Reservoir and Gwanggyosan Mountain. This area is thus great for light hiking, strolling and relaxing. Among the many museums with unique themes are Suwon Museum, the city's top museum, Suwon Gwanggyo Museum, which collects the artifacts excavated when Gwanggyo New Town was established, Football (Soccer) Museum, where the ball Ahn Jung-hwan used to score the winning sudden-death goal in the 2002 World Cup against Italy is displayed, and National Map Museum.

**Suwon beef ribs** MAP 10

Originating from the restaurant Hwachunok on Rice Store Street at Yeongdong Market in the 1940s, Suwon beef ribs in 1985 were designated the unique local food of Suwon. Compared to beef ribs made elsewhere, Suwon's are king-size ribs seasoned with salt before grilling.









Though Suwon beef ribs can be tasted all over the city, the restaurants serving the best versions are in Yeongdong Market, Nosong Zone (Imok-dong) and the area between Dongsuwon Intersection and Suwon IC.

**Bongnyeongsa Temple** MAP 9

Located at the foot of Gwanggyosan Mountain, Bongnyeongsa is one of the oldest traditional Buddhist temples in Suwon. It was founded in 1208 (fourth year of Goryeo Dynasty King Huijong's reign) by the Venerable Wongakguksa. The stone statue of the Buddha Triad from the Goryeo Dynasty, Sinjung Portrait of the Buddha at Yaksajeon Hall and the Hyeonwang Portrait of the Buddha are designated tangible cultural assets of Gyeonggi -Province. ## Gwanggyosan Mountain MAP 7

Standing 582 meters above sea level, the famous mountain Gwanggyosan stretches over the cities of Suwon, Yongin and Uiwang in Gyeonggi Province and is among the Eight Scenic Spots of Suwon. On the mountain live fireflies, which are known to indicate a clean area. The many historical sites there include Changeongsan Temple, and 10 courses for hiking the mountain are available. At Forest Park on the mountain, a trail extends from the entrance of Cheongryangmam Hermitage to Gyeonggi Institute of Health and Environment, leading to Jige-gil and Mosu-gil, which are among the "Palsaek-gil(Eight Colorful Streets of Suwon)."

With a wide lawn, walkways, music fountain and ecological stream, Gwanggyo Park is a green area inside the city. Depending on season, flowers and trees show pleasant colors, making the park excellent for strolling. Gwanggyo Reservoir has a 10 km-long trail (*dulle-gil*) along the waterside. In spring, thousands of people visit to see the cherry blossoms along the reservoir. Rent a bicycle from the bicycle rental shop in the reservoir to ride around the waterside.

This is the nation's largest in-city lake park with nine fountain facilities, a 6.5km-long circular walkway, family camping area, multipurpose interactive center, outdoor performance hall that can also be used as a family picnic area, and sports climbing center. Other spaces are harmonized with nature such as the Quiet Forest, Happy Flower Island and Forest of Distant Island.

Suwon Convention Center is slated for completion in 2019 and will serve as a city landmark with exhibition, meeting and MICE facilities. In addition, a department store, hotel and large aquarium will be constructed near the center.

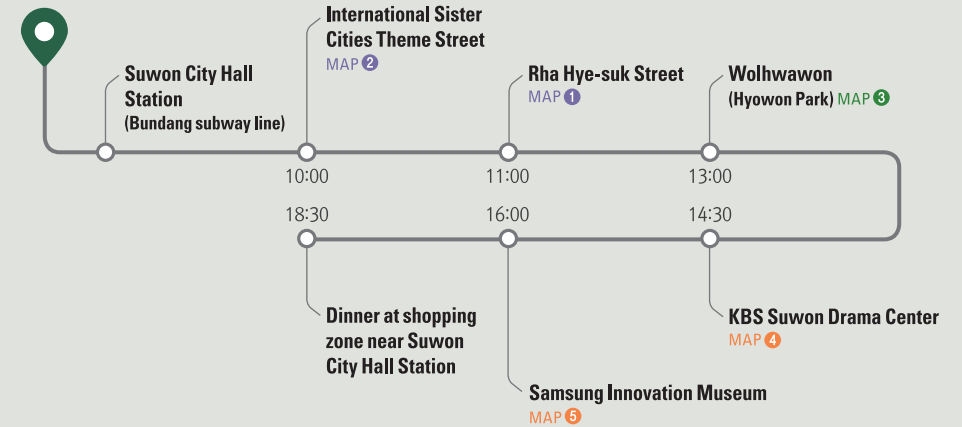
# 03 Street with themes of history and culture Around Suwon City Hall

Because the tourist attractions of Suwon City Hall are located downtown, the use of public transportation is highly recommended to get to them. Getting off at Suwon City Hall Station (Bundang subway line), visitors can find tourist attractions within a 20-minute walk. Suwon Bus Terminal is also nearby, so visitors can ride buses as well.



## Recommended tours

In the city center is Rha Hye-suk Street, which commemorates Korea's first female Western-style painter, and the International Sister Cities Theme Street (Marronnier Street) has symbolic sculptures of 16 cities abroad having sister ties with Suwon. Wolhwawon (Hyowon Park) is famous as a filming site for dramas, KBS Suwon Drama Center allows visitors to see how dramas are produced and Samsung Innovation Museum features the history and technology of Samsung Electronics. Major shopping malls that include department stores and outlets are also located in downtown Suwon.




## Rha Hye-suk Street MAP 1

This cultural street honors the accomplishments of Rha Hye-suk (1896-1948), Korea's leading "new woman" and an independent activist and Western-style painter.

Displayed here are her statues, paintings, exhibits, sculptures and other works. Spectacles and events such as street performances on the pedestrian-only streets are also held.

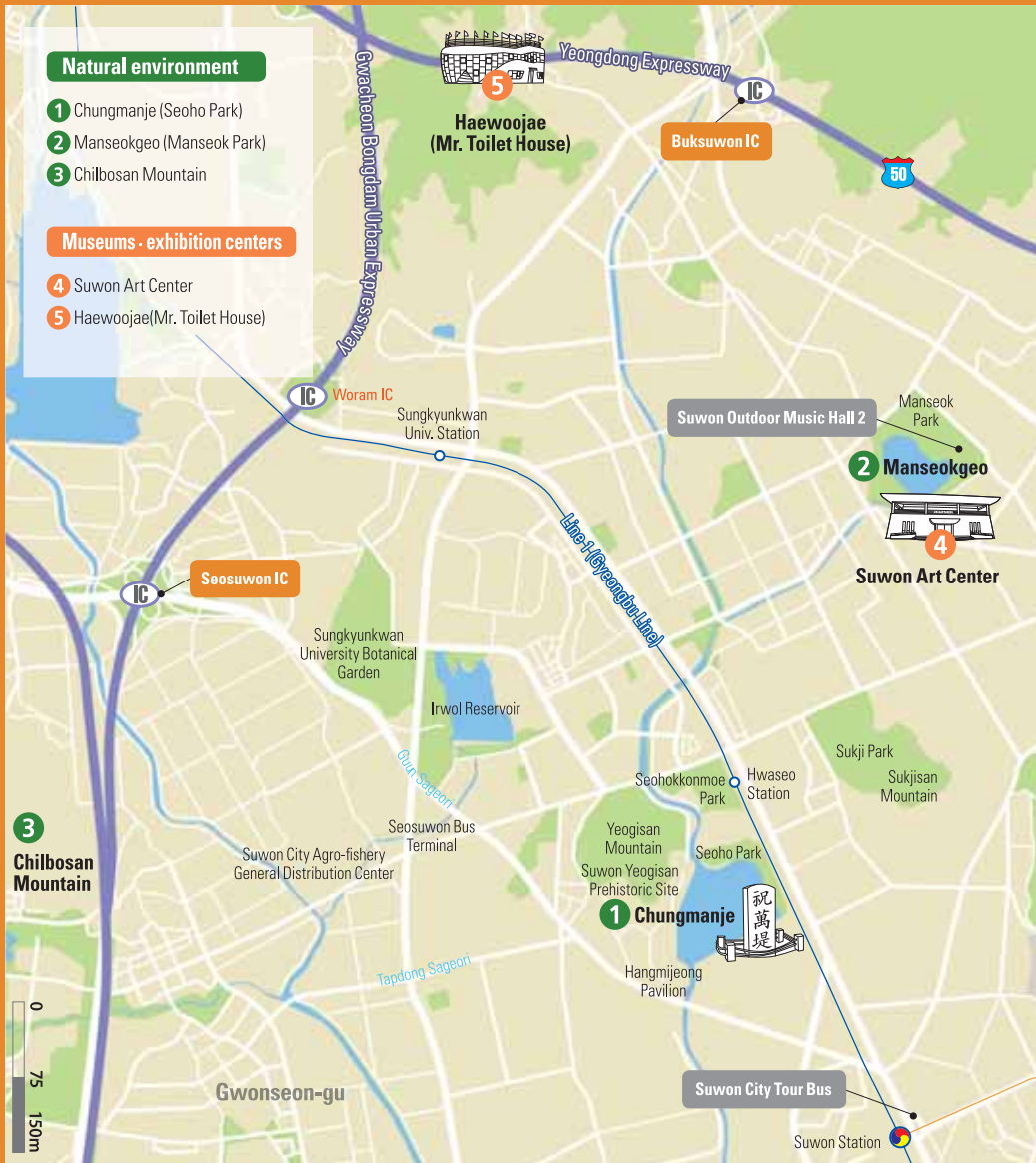

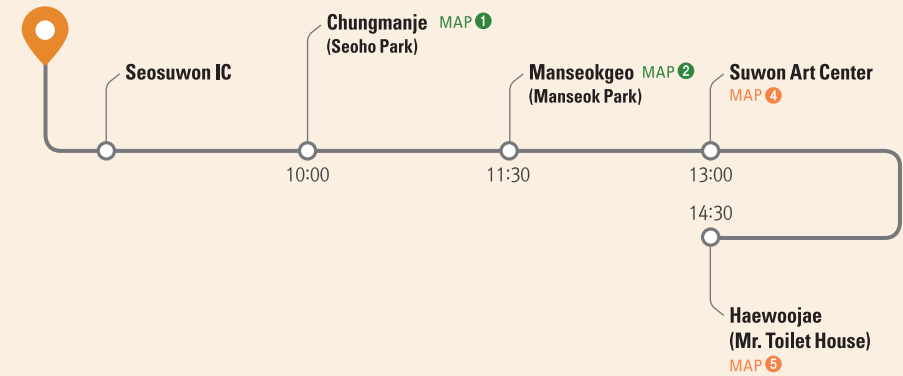
# 04 Haewoojae(Mr. Toilet House) and beautiful urban waterside Seosuwon

To visit Seosuwon, visitors should use Seosuwon IC, Buksuwon IC and Suwon Station. Haewoojae(Mr. Toilet House) is near Buksuwon IC, and Chungmanje, a reservoir built by King Jeongjo, is close to Seosuwon IC. Take a bus from Suwon Station to get to Chungmanje. Meanwhile, Ilwol Reservoir is about a 10-minute walk from Seosuwon (West Suwon) Bus Terminal.






## Recommended tours

The reservoirs of Manseokgeo and Chungmanje are can't-miss places when touring Suwon. Located within the city and with excellent accessibility, the waterside spaces and the sunset seen here are simply dazzling. Manseokgeo and Chungmanje also boast historic significance as they were built by King Jeongjo. And Haewoojae(Mr. Toilet House), nicknamed "Poop Museum," is also a unique tourist attraction.



## Chungmanje (Seoho Park) MAP 1

King Jeongjo had Chungmanje built in 1799 to prepare for drought. It is also called Seoho (west lake) because of its location on the west side of Suweon Hwaseong Fortress. Chungmanje in 2016 was named a World Irrigation Facility Heritage by the International Commission on Irrigation and Drainage (ICID). At the south of the lake is Hangmijeong Pavilion visited by Emperor Sunjong with beautiful scenery. And the sunset is one of the Eight Scenic Views of Suwon.

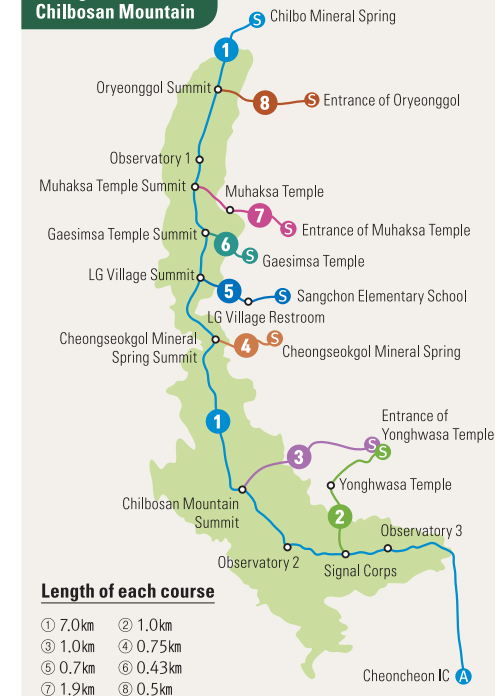

## Streets of Suwon

### Palsaek-gil (Eight Colorful Streets of Suwon)

If the island of Jeju has "Olle-gil," Suwon has "Palsaek-gil (Eight Colorful Streets)." The eight connect all regions of Suwon, and visitors can experience the city's history, culture and nature by taking to these streets. Mosu-gil is "the street of life;" Jige-gil is the best scenic street of Suwon; Maesil-gil has the atmosphere of streams and forests; Yeou-gil connects Gwanggyo Reservoir and Woncheon Lake; Doran-gil connects downtown Yeongtong; Suwon Dulle-gil surrounds the city limits of Suwon; Hyohaeng-gil was used by King Jeongjo to visit Hyeollyungwon Royal Tomb; and Hwaseongseonggwak-gil connects Suwon Hwaseong Fortress as one. The eight tour courses cover a combined distance of 147.8 km.

### Bicycle streets (courses)

The bicycle courses of Suwon consist of those of Suwon Hwaseong Fortress Tour, Hwaseo Station Circulation, Hwanggyujcheon Stream Circulation and Yeongtong Station Circulation. The fortress Course is further divided into Course 1, which starts from Paldalmun Gate and goes through Changnyongmun Gate and Suwon Hwaseong Museum, and Course 2, which goes through Janganmun Gate, Hwaseomun Gate, Gyeonggi-do Provincial Government and Hwaseong Haenggung Palace. For tourist convenience, bicycle rental stores are located at Janganmun Gate, Hwaseomun Gate, Yeonmudae (Dongjangdae, Eastern Command Post) and Hwaseong Haenggung Palace. Meanwhile, the stream course passes through natural streams, the Yeongtong Station course goes around the downtown area centered on the station and the Hwaseo Station course explores Chungmanje and Seocho Park.

### Suwon Hwaseong Cultural Festival

Suwon Hwaseong Cultural Festival is the city's top festival named a "Promising Festival for Cultural Tourism in 2017," celebrating the unique traditions, culture and history of Korea. The majestic ceremonies include the reenactments of the royal parade of King Jeongjo and the birthday ceremony of his mother. Many other events are held around Suwon over the festival period.



### Re-enactment of King Jeongjo's royal parade

The massive royal parade of King Jeongjo re-enacts the 22nd Joseon Dynasty's king visit to Suwon Hwaseong Fortress in 1795. More than 1,800 performers and dozens of horses take part in the parade.



### Re-enactment of court culture

The 60th birthday ceremony of King Jeongjo's mother and gwageo (the highest-level state examination during the Joseon Dynasty) ceremony held by the king are re-enacted. Presenting a unique spectacle, the re-enactment offers a prime opportunity to experience traditional Korean culture.



### Martial arts brand performance "Yajo"

The performance re-enacts the evening military training of Jangyongyeong soldiers as recorded in "Wonhaeng Eulmyojeongni Uigwe (Royal Protocols)." This outdoor performance is held at Changnyongmun Gate, the fortress walls, on a large grass stage. The brilliant spectacle features many performers, lighting, sounds, videos and martial arts performances all blended into one.

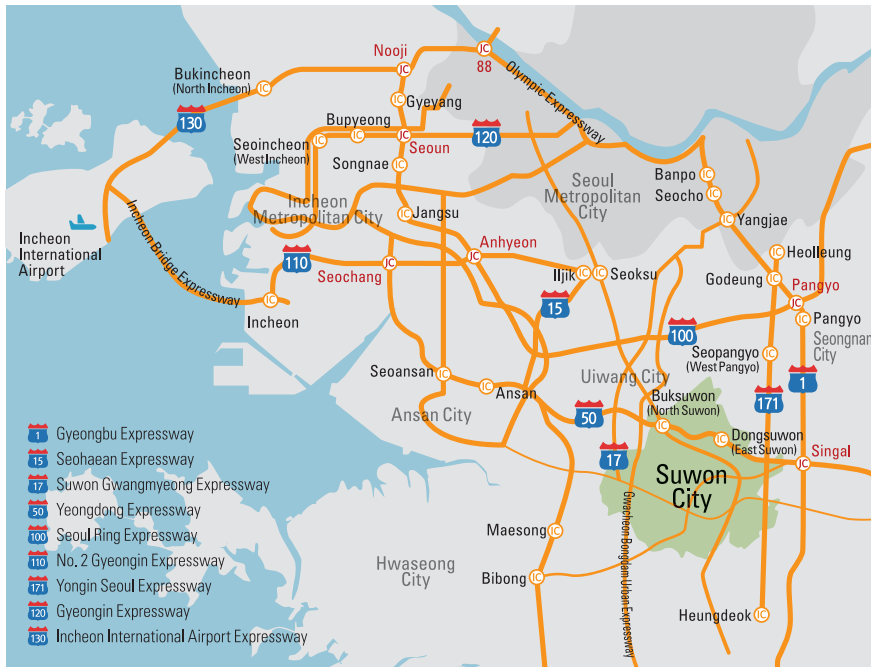

## Traffic information for touring Suwon

### Expressways

As the center of transportation in the Seoul metropolitan area, Suwon is located in the south-central part of Gyeonggi Province. The city is located one hour away from Seoul (by subway and bus) and adjacent to the cities of Yongin, Hwaseong, Uiwang and Ansan. Taking any form of public transportation including the subway, train, KTX and intra-city red buses will allow quick and convenient access to Suwon. 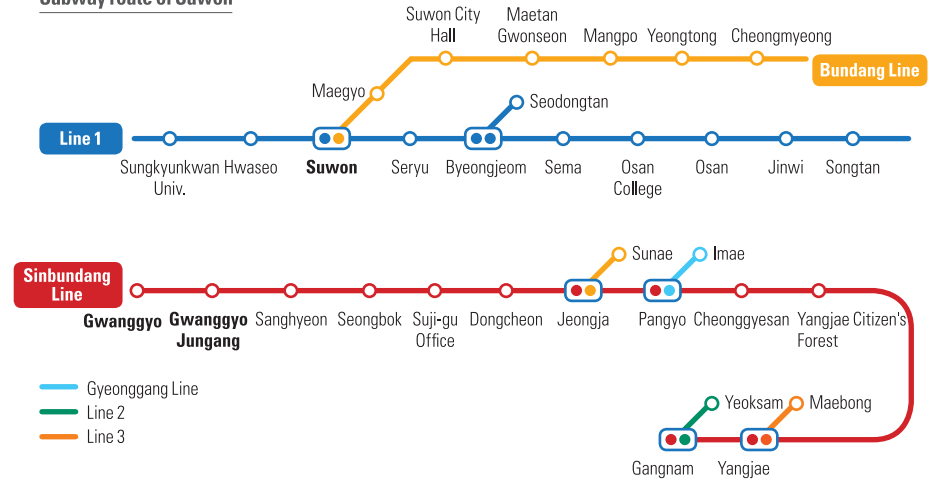

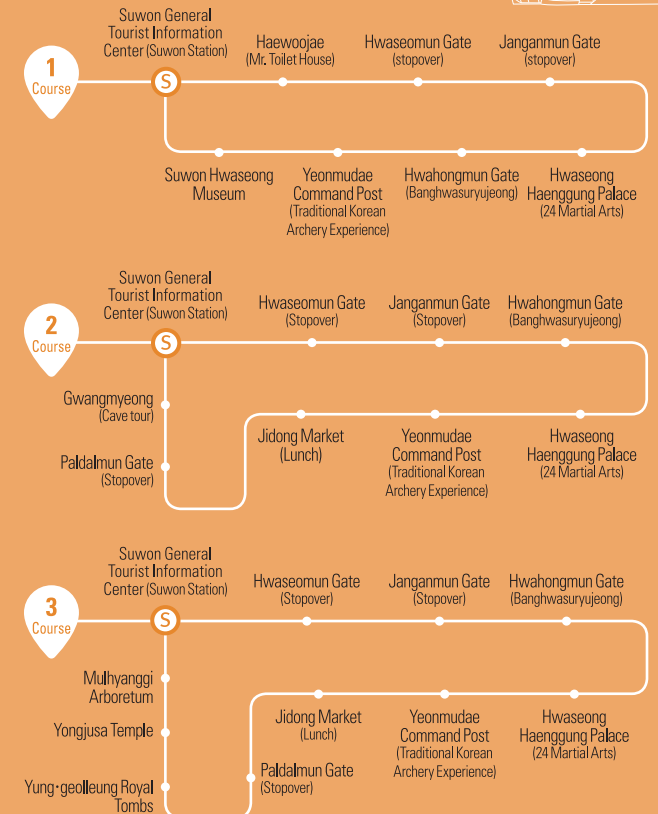
